Students can view scholarship requirements in MyUI

- Continuous full-time enrollment
- Certain UI cumulative GPA

Mid-year review

• 2.0 UI GPA and at least 1 hour of completed coursework

Spring review

- 24 completed UI hours
- GPA required by scholarship

# Scholarship Appeals



### Impact of Dropping Classes or Withdrawal

- Withdrawing can result in cancellation of future scholarships
- Students who leave Iowa, take classes at another institution, and later return to Iowa are not eligible for appeals
- Students should always talk with the Office of Student Financial Aid prior to changing enrollment

### Exceptions for Co-op or Internships

• To request the scholarship "hold", email <u>adm-appeals@uiowa.edu</u> to provide details about your co-op/internship

### Appeals for Currently Enrolled Students

- Reasons for appeal (serious medical condition, death of family member, other circumstances beyond control)
- Submitting your appeal
  - Email <u>adm-appeals@uiowa.edu</u> with name, ID, details on why not meeting criteria, thorough plan of study)
- Appeal Deadline is first Friday of the semester which you are appealing for reinstatement
